Councillor Juvik commented on a flooding problem, which occurred on Sunday on Elementary Road and advised that staff responded fairly quickly to the problem. Councillor Juvik commented on the Public Information Meeting regarding recycling

Councillor Anderson commented on the Public Information Meeting regarding recycling and advised that Council has made an informal decision to go ahead with the curb side pickup and that a combination payment structure is being looked at i.e. payment would partially come out of general revenue and would partially be applied to home owners on their tax notices. Councillor Anderson commented on the APC meeting held on February 26<sup>th</sup> and advised the newly elected Chair is Dan Kirchner and the Vice-Chair is Darren Smurthwaite.
